

## City of Dover Meeting Minutes August 2020

August 4, 2020

The Regular Monthly Meeting of the Dover City Council was called to order at 7:00 PM by Acting Mayor Dave Iseminger.

Present were Council Members (Acting Mayor) Dave Iseminger, Jaime Putzier, Cameron Johnson and Kevin Connor; absent- Mayor Roger Ihrke, City Clerk/Treasurer Gary Pedersen and Water Superintendent Marvin Ihrke. Others in attendance were: Jill Veerkamp-St. Charles Press, Elizabeth Wolter, Kim Shea, Brad Glynn and Patti Kronebusch.

The September meeting is scheduled for Thursday September 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Motion by member Johnson and seconded by member Connor to approve the agenda as presented, motion carried.

Guests: Brad Glynn,

Mr. Glynn is requesting a liquor license transfer for Neighbors Bar from the Kronebuschs' to himself.

Motion by member Connor and seconded by member Putzier to approve the transfer to Mr. Glynn, motion carried. Mr. Glynn plans on keeping the name of the bar as "Neighbors".

Motion by member Johnson and seconded by member Connor to approve last month's meeting minutes with one correction, in the 4<sup>th</sup> to the last paragraph change "the" to "a", motion carried.

Motion by member Johnson and seconded by member Putzier to approve and pay the financials as presented, the motion carried.

Clerk Report Items:

Clerk was not present to make his comment list.

The council is directing the Clerk to move forward with the process of collection or shutting off the water of those identified the month before with accounts over \$600 owed.

Old Business:

Acting Mayor Iseminger opened up the "chicken" discussion by saying in his research from the month before he found very little against allowing chickens as a use in residential areas.

Member Johnson stated he was fine with up to 8 hens/chickens allowed. Member Johnson edited the proposed chicken ordinance put together by the City Clerk, he offered them as official changes to the document.

Motion by member Putzier and seconded by member Connor to approve the suggested changes for approval and move the ordinance forward, motion carried.

Council member concerns:

Member Connor asked about the scoreboard that hangs in the City Hall gym, if it were available for sale, someone he knew was interested. Council members thought it should stay at least until we know what we will be doing with the building long-term.

Member Johnson asked that the ball fields be dragged by the maintenance person for league games that are being played.

Acting Mayor Iseminger asked Member Johnson about the stop sign and its location west of his house. Member Johnson said it was located to accommodate utilities and future curb and gutters, that led to its location back from the street.

Motion by member Johnson and seconded by member Connor to adjourn at about 7:25 PM.
