

## **MEETING MINUTES FOR JULY 2016**

July 7, 2016

Called to order at 7:00 P.M. Present were Mayor Ihrke, Dave Iseminger, Melinda Kieffer, Jaime Putzier, Marvin Ihrke, Jill Vehrenkamp from the St. Charles Press, Bryan Todd from the Rochester Post Bulletin, and Lance Krekow. Not present was Matt Elder

Agenda was presented for approval. Motion was made by Dave Iseminger to approve, seconded by Melinda Kieffer. All agreed. Motion carried.

Meeting minutes from June were presented for approval. Motion was made by Dave Iseminger to approve, seconded by Melinda Kieffer. All agreed. Motion carried.

Bills were presented for approval. Motion was made by Melinda Kieffer to approve, seconded by Jaime Putzier. All agreed. Motion carried.

Minutes from the Dover Public Hearing on the Dover School were presented for approval. Motion was made by Dave Iseminger to approve, seconded by Jaime Putzier.

Dave Iseminger stated that the school hearing went very well. He did think that more people from the community would show up. 24 people attended including the council members. A survey letter will be handed out to the residents for their feedback.

Sheriff Torgerson enters at 7:09 P.M. He stopped in to say and asked how everything is going in Dover. The council asked him about checking out the vehicles on the property on Pleasant Street. We could find out who they are registered too, send them a letter.

If no response we would have them towed. These fees would then be added on to their property taxes. The current delinquent taxes and special assessments on that particular property is \$3,257.88 as of June 2016.

Sheriff Torgerson suggested that the Sheriffs Department could have a use for the Dover School building. That would be for training purposes. He exits at 7:30P.M.

It was mentioned that Olmsted County has blacktop material for any patching that we would have for any of our streets.

The Council approved the road project by Cameron Johnson's residence. An agreement was signed between him and the City. We need to go thru the assessment hearing at the August 2016 meeting.

Lance Krekow submitted his hours for June 2016.

Melinda Kieffer and Jaime Putzier stated that the Summer Recreation Program is going well. There is a Valley Fair bus trip planned for the end of July.

Dave Iseminger said that there is an interest in an Archery Range in Dover. This possibly could be located in the parking lot next to the Ball Field.

Buck Emery who resides at 104 North Chatfield Street entered. He is complaining about speeding traffic going past his residence on County Road #10. He is asking to set up a squad car to tell how fast vehicles are going. The City Clerk will check with the Sheriff's Department regarding this concern.

It was brought up as to whom to contact about water/sewer issues when Marvin Ihrke is out of town.

New water meters on the west side of County Road #10 in town will be installed sometime in August of this year. The company will be sending out letters to those residents.

Media Com will now sponsor International Channels.

Mayor Ihrke informed the council that the Minnesota Department of Health is requiring all cities to do a Well Head Protection plan within the next 3 years regarding our two wells. This will cost the City of Dover some money. This needs to be put in the budget for 2017.

The budget should also include money for our Dover Cemetery.

New soccer nets are needed at the Dover City Park. Stumps need to be ground out also.

Lance Krekow stated that whoever is mowing the Ball Park is chewing up the fence. Mayor Ihrke will contact our mowing service.

A letter needs to be sent to a property owner in Dover whose dogs are running loose.

Letter was sent to an owner of a Semi-Truck regarding the reefer that is running all night. He was asked to park somewhere other than in town. We also had a complaint about a semi-truck parked up by the new water tower. This will be checked out.

With no further business, a motion was made by Dave Iseminger to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Melinda Kieffer. All agreed. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:20 P.M.
